Detailed Description of Project The project main goals are: 1: Through this project 600 people with disability, local community, authority, members of NGOs and other displaced people men and women in Tirinkot city of Uruzgan province will receive electoral workshops and awareness raising, they will be encouraged and mobilized to participate in the election and will share the ideas related to electoral reform and increasing accessibility for disabled voters. 2: the talk shows and interview will be broadcasted in the local radio channels. Detailed description of project

Project Goal: the organization goal is to promote a barrier free, accessible, socio-political and economic environment for women with disabilities and displaced women in Afghanistan. To this end, AOAD leaders and staff are proposing to develop the empowerment of Women with Disabilities and Displaced Women in Afghanistan Program.

Project Objectives:

Enhancing women's participation in the political realm;

Increasing women's advocacy for legislative change;

Raising women's awareness of their constitutional rights within Afghanistan's complex legal traditions; and

Developing women's leadership, networking and advocacy skills.

The Organization's international association networking partners included: Soulful Presence (SP), Asia Pacific Center on Disability, Rehabilitation International and the CBR Asia Pacific Network. SP provided in-kind support to the proposed project. SP, a nonprofit organization located in New Mexico, was committed to creating innovative ideas and solutions that specifically respond to issues impacting vulnerable populations, including individuals with disabilities; seniors; crime victims; at-risk youth; and low income families. SP's mission is to empower underserved populations by creating awareness and advancing policy, research, education, and social action. In recent years, SP staff has participated in projects designed to improve the quality of life for marginalized people with disabilities internationally.

M&E: To measure the identified goals, objectives and outputs, organization staff engaged in evaluation and monitoring activities on regular bases. Monitoring led by the organization staff along with two members of senior management. AOAD staff included in the M&E the community members, committee members and district authorities at all stages.

The proposed program specifically focused on women with disabilities, displaced women, and women who are victims of war and conflict. The program has been designed to ensure that Afghan women with disabilities and displaced women are empowered to engage in democratic action and participated fully in the political realm as leaders, advocates and voters. As part of the proposed program, two qualified trainers engaged with 1000 women with disabilities, displaced women and women who are victims of landmines and war and conflict in a series of seminars during a six month period.

Type of services provided

The organization achived the following outputs:

- A training center established and 2 qualified trainers hired.
- Training curricula developed and translated.
- The seminars publicized via the media.
- One-thousand (1,000) women with disabilities, displaced women, and women who are survivors of land minds and war conflict recruited and participated in the seminars.
- Twenty seminars conducted. 50 women participated in each seminar.
- Displaced participants received assistance in obtaining their national identity and voting cards.

Detailed description of project The overall objective of the skills training "To provide skills development and Vocational Training to 100 children with disability, boys and girls, in order to restore their self-confidence and access to respectable income and employment opportunities". Project phases: To a c h i e v e the project development objective, Skills training program has been organized into three main phases' separate but mutually reinforcing each other. Phase (1) pre-selection phase(2) implementation phase, and (3) job placement. The first two phases have been organized around a specific set of overall expected project outcomes with a scope for developing skills training and build the capacity of children and young person with disability or those who have other disabled family members (father, mother, brother, sister and etc). During the 2nd phases the organization recruited staff, selected children according to their field of interest, developed plan for skills training and implemented the activities. The third phase has been organized to support the two technical phases with development of necessary human skills and capacities for their effective implementation and achievements. The organization reviewed, collected, and analyzed all the available data and reports on children, who are living with disability and the data was carried out taking into account the baseline collected in 2009 and annual reports of 2009 and 2010 according to the disability record in DoLSAMD (Directorate of Labour, Social Affairs, Martyrs and Disabled. The pre-selection phase (data collection), was carried out in Jalalabad city and remote areas, where there are children and young persons with disability. Basically, the data was used and analyzed at the end of data collection, which was compared with previous experience from past projects.
